

Mullins Descendancy

This is the parental family of Alfred J. Mullins who married Julia Tryphina Dorey and had five children, one of whom married Andrew Willis Bryne. This family lived Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

Francis. L. Mullins. B. abt. 1793 Ireland; d. 4-27-1866 Montreal; bur. 5-1-1866 Basilica of Notre Dame. Father: Francis Mullins (d. 1863 Montreal of a fever, a poor man; bur. 1863 Basilica of Notre Dame). On 3-31-1809 he joined the military in Montreal; he was age 18, born Drogheda, Co. Louth, Ireland; joined 90th Foot Soldiers, 2nd Battalion for unlimited service. Surname spelled Mullin. Calculated birth year is 1791. Did he lie about his age? His daughter Roseanna reported he immigrated to Canada shortly after 1819.

- m. 2-23-1824 Rosanna Connolly at the Basilica of Notre Dame, Montreal. Born abt. 1799; died Nov. 1876; bur. Basilica Notre Dame, Montreal. Marriage record says Francis was the oldest son of Morgan Mullins and Ellen Laughlin of Cork in Ireland; Rosanna was the eldest daughter of Michael Connolly and Sarah McCabe. Signed by Michael Connolly (his mark), Edward McNaughton, Mary Murphy (?), James McCabe. I read her given name as "Roxanne" on son Alfred's marriage record.

 - m. 6-17-1851 Jean Lukin Leprohon at Basilica Notre Dame, Montreal. Born 4-7-1822 Chambly, La Vallée-du-Richelieu, Quebec; died 5-23-1900 Montreal. Parents Edouard-Martial Leprohon and Marie-Anne-Louise Lukin.

- iv. Anna Maria Mansfield Mullins, b. 1832 Montreal; d. 11-18-1876; bur. McDonnell family lot in Notre-Dame-des-Neiges (cemetery) in Montreal "Beloved Wife of Angus C MacDonell M.D. \ Died: 18 November 1876 \ aged 42 years"
 - m. 1854 Angus Cameron McDonnell at Basilica Notre Dame, Montreal. Born abt. 1827 Roxborough, Ontario; died 11-3-1913 Glengarry, Ontario. Parents Allan Lundy MacDonell Esq. (1776–1859) and Margaret Cameron (1789–1885). His second wife was Marie L. Filiatrault, they married 1880. Angus studied medicine at and graduated from McGill University in 1852, he practiced for 50 years in Montreal; he was a professor on the university's staff in 1877.
